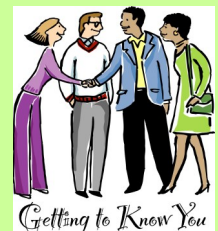

How do you feel about Easter being on April Fools Day? Can you just anticipate the haters talking about how believing in the resurrection is just for fools. But if so, I am more than happy to be a fool for Christ. As we approach Resurrection Day we might be considering what that day means to us. Those who have theological thoughts about it will know that the resurrection is the foundation upon which Christianity is built. Paul says that if Christ is not raised we are still in our sins. ¹⁷And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins. ¹⁸Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ are lost. ¹⁹If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are to be pitied more than all others. (1 Corinthians 15:17-19) Yes, the resurrection is necessary for our salvation and for our Eternal hope. If you are relational or a person who puts lots of emphasis on relationships for you the resurrection probably means that you have hope of seeing your loved ones that have died. Each time you pass a cemetery you might think that one-day those graves will be empty. ¹³Brothers and sisters, we do not want you to be uninformed about those who sleep in death, so that you do not grieve like the rest, who have no hope. ¹⁴We believe that Jesus died and rose again, and so we believe that God will bring with Jesus those who have fallen asleep in him. (1 Thessalonians 4:13-14) If you think in emotional terms then perhaps the resurrection means that you have great hope. Regardless how difficult or easy our days there is something so much better coming. And then for all of us regardless how we might think of the resurrection, it means that we have a message to share.


³For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, ⁴that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, (1 Corinthians 15:3-4)

We have a month to consider what the resurrection means to us. I trust that you will contemplate the impact of Jesus being alive and well. For me, it means our lives count. Our work is never without merit and one day we will both see him and enjoy Him forever.

As the weather warms up this month lets do some warming up to our Lord and to all those around us that He has given into our care.

A Note from the Board of Trustees . . .

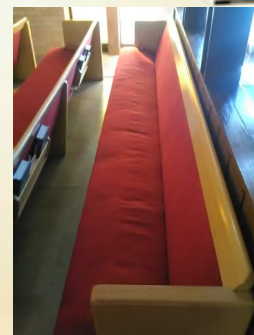
Pause a moment to consider your church pew - that solid upholstered bench with comfortable back support that awaits you each time you enter the sanctuary. No matter the occasion, be it worship service, wedding, funeral, or Vacation Bible School, it is ready when you arrive. In fact, the pews in our sanctuary have been in place to welcome and provide comfortable seating since the church was built in 1962. Now they are close to 60 years old.

We have been hearing that our pews are less comfortable and inviting these days. They are showing their age as padding compacts, stains and snags show on the upholstery, and it's even possible some springs have sprung! Up-keep of church property is one of our main concerns, so the Board of Trustees has considered the situation and determined that repairing and reupholstering our 35 pews is a worthy project for 2018. There are companies that do the necessary work on site. We have begun contacting some of them, seeking bids for our consideration.

Please share your thoughts with us. We look forward to hearing from you. Information received thus far indicates we should anticipate costs in the range of \$18,000 to \$20,000. Donations will be gratefully accepted as we work together to maintain the warm and welcoming environment for all who enter our sanctuary.
