As I write this article I am working on the last sermon from our series on 2 Corinthians. It has been good for me to spend these last months reading and studying both First Corinthians and the Second letter. I have been struck with the thought over and over again that the Corinthian church has many of the characteristics of the modern church in America. The American church encounters every day a society that is running from God. It is running not because it believes, and seeks to hide but because it no longer believes and wishes to dismiss Him.

How a church exists in such a setting and how much that environment affects them are interesting questions that I hope we have wrestled together with, during this series. Not allowing our minds to be conformed to this world but transformed by the Spirit of God and His Word is essential for our spiritual welfare in a dark place. Like the church in Corinth, not everything we experience is darkness. God has given plenty of light for our journey. We must love light **more** than we love the darkness of this world.

Paul as he wrote to the Corinthian church continued to hold them accountable for their behavior. Many in the church rebelled against his authority and looked other places for leadership. Often this was in all the wrong places with all the wrong people. Most of us also have this temptation to seek to please those around us, rather than the one above us.

The letters to the Corinthians constantly call us to hear the Word of the Lord and be committed to "doing the Word" in our own lives. There is a lot written in the Bible that our society finds offensive or wrong. This makes our reliance upon it even more important for us, and for those who will one day follow us in the church.

As I think back to my youth and how much of what I learned, that today I am committed to, I am convinced that we must continue that process of discipleship especially with the young people in our midst. Paul understood that with this young church in Corinth there must be built strong foundations of truth. Then that truth must be allowed to direct the behavior of those who embrace it. A great moral error of our time is believing one thing and doing another. Walking in faith demands that we practice what we believe. This creates authenticity for the church and peace for the believer.

Faith without works is dead.

Trusting Jesus *without* following Him is our most fatal flaw.

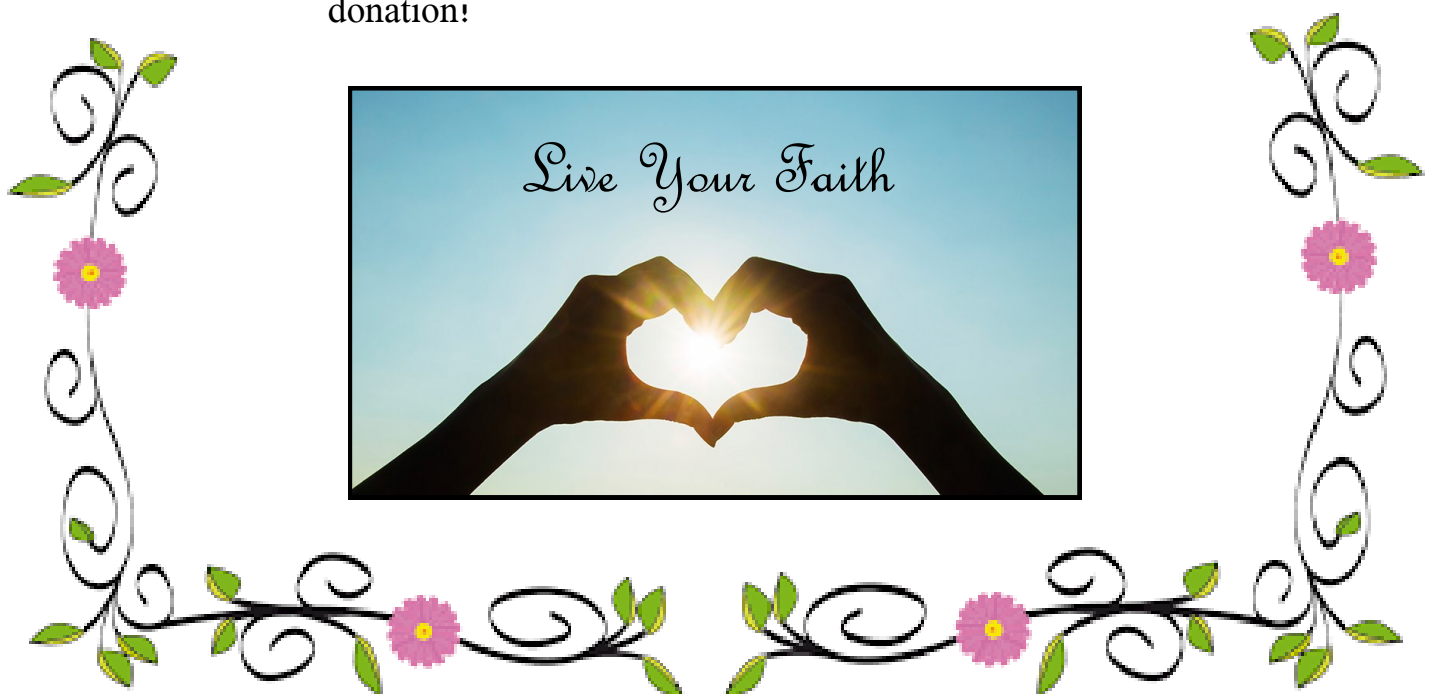
